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## **GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT:**

*(It's Miller Time!)*

### **Office/Shop**

In April we finished off the movement of 4 units as well as the regular work done in B50, both through the administrative office and the maintenance shop.

There were also numerous meetings which included our committees, Board, and Members. There were also a number of cupboards installed, ducts cleaned, floors done, a few bathrooms repaired/replaced, and locks replaced/repared.

The Board of Directors, the Committees and the office will be working on next year's budget over the next few months to bring to the Membership in June.

### **Budget Process**



Every year in the spring the budget for the next year is created based on numbers from previous years, information gathered about upcoming changes to utility payments and other services, plus input from committees, staff and members. The Board of Directors, staff and committees have also been trying to look at the budget in a different way and are gathering the tools to enable this to be done.

Generally though, the first step of the budget process is to gather estimates and information from staff and outside agencies. Committees are asked to submit their budgets and general information where their funds will be spent.

This information is then taken to the Finance Committee for review and adjustments.

Following the Finance Committee meeting, there is a joint meeting between the Board, Finance Committee and Chairpersons (or other representatives) of the remaining Committees. At this meeting the budget is reviewed, adjusted and finalized for approval by the membership.

The last step of the process is the June budget meeting where the proposed budget is presented to the



Membership. Members receive the meeting package with the proposed budget to review, at the meeting members are asked to provide their input and ask any questions they have. After discussion the Members are asked to vote whether or not they accept the proposed budget.

- If the budget is approved it is used for the next financial year starting November 1.
- If the budget is not approved, suggestions are taken back, the budget is reworked and a special meeting is called to present the reworked budget, discuss the changes and have another vote.

Questions and feedback prior to the June member's meeting are also welcome. Just submit your question or feedback to the office and we will ensure it makes it to the right place. Answers may be communicated through the newsletter so all members can benefit from the information.

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### **PROPERTY ENHANCEMENT COMMITTEE**

After the May long weekend you can turn your lawn service on. Call in a work order if any of the downspouts are damaged or missing, or if the eaves are plugged.

Members are reminded that any work required as a result of last summer's yard inspections should be completed by the end of August. Please contact the office if you have any questions or concerns. To assist with this work the Committee would like to know if there are any members available and who would like to help other members with painting or staining of fences and decks, or re-shingling shed roofs.

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### **PROPERTY MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE:**



Spring is here so of course it has snowed again. Please keep your down spouts down. Check your furnace filters regularly and if they are dirty change them; filters are available for free at B50. Our cold air return grates need to be vacuumed off regularly as well as the bathroom fan covers.

A few issues have recently been noted during the course of the regular furnace maintenance and inspections. Please keep the following important points in mind:

- By code 24 inches of unobstructed access is required all around the furnace. Do not place shelving or store anything up against the furnace.
- Do not hang anything from the gas lines or the water lines in the basement. The weight could cause a breakage in the gas lines; metal hangers can cause corrosion on the metal water lines.
- If you keep a kitty litter box near the furnace, or cold air returns, please move it away. Alternatively you may place a barrier in between the litter box and the furnace, or cold air return, without blocking the air flow. The dust from the litter can get into the furnaces and cause them to not work properly.
- If you have birds please don't place the cage too close to the cold air returns because the feathers can also get into the furnace and cause it to not work properly.

An additional reminder that Drano, or other drain cleaning products, are not to be used to clear clogged drains. These products do cause corrosion in older lines such as ours, but most importantly these products pose a **very serious safety risk** to our maintenance staff! If a sink is not draining properly please just call in a work order to B50 rather than using Drano.

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### ECO ALLEY – NEWS YOU CAN USE:

#### **MAKE EVERYDAY EARTH DAY – REDUCE, RECYCLE, AND RELIEVE THE PLANET OF ITS LANDFILL BURDEN**

**Do more than the 3 R's. Besides reduce, reuse, and recycle, also: research, repair, rent and repurpose.**

Experts report that our landfills are overflowing with textile waste, in other words ... clothing. Your closets need an ethical upgrade. Before you buy check on the brand, label, or designer by visiting <https://goodonyou.eco/> or downloading the **Good on You app**. If a brand is doing something sustainable for the environment, you can bet they will be proudly promoting it on their website or social media. Check where their clothes are made, what they pay their workers, what materials they use and how they are dealing with waste.



**Become a conscientious shopper:** Buying second hand clothing for environmental reasons has become very popular. Keep it going – check Value Village, Good Will, consignment stores, and online market places.

**Choose sustainable fabrics** that are made with natural fibers and require minimal chemical fertilizers. Choose wool, organic cotton, linen and hemp. Research online for the fabrics and methods the brand uses.

**Don't add to the landfill!** Upcycle your now unloved but gently used clothing items by donating to a charity shop. (Women in Need, Diabetes Society, Inclusion Alberta, Thrift Shops, etc.)

**Buy less:** We now consume 60% more clothing than we did 20 years ago and we keep our clothes for half as long. Reducing the amount we buy will make a huge difference with respect to waste.

**Repair** garments to extend their life. Grab a needle and thread and sew a button on or repair a hole in the toe of a sock.

**Rent** instead of buying a fancy gown or suit for your next big event. Rental companies have designer clothes at a fraction of the cost and the best thing is, that they won't be single wear items because someone will rent it after you.

**Clothing swaps** are a new idea and a great way to give new life to unwanted clothing.

Build a sustainable wardrobe and become a more conscientious shopper.

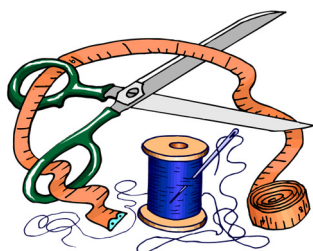
