The next meeting of the Environment Committee is on January 14th, 2020 at 7:00 PM in B50. Please come out and join us as we sure would like to see some new members.



Visitors stalls are for visitors not residents.


Some leaves and needles left on the ground is good for the environment.

ECO ALLEY – NEWS YOU CAN USE: REDUCE, REUSE, REPURPOSE, RECYCLE

Just a few friendly reminders on recycling 'what goes where?' during this season of gift giving and accumulating boxes and bags, ribbons and bows, and food.

FOOD WASTE: COMPOST all plate scrapings, meat, fish, shellfish, poultry, BONES including ALL TURKEY, CHICKEN, AND OTHER MEATS, fruits and vegetables (remove any stickers), breads, noodles, rice, grains, crackers, cereal, cookies, cakes, muffins, eggs and egg shells, dairy – including sour cream and cheese, nuts and seeds, popcorn, candy, coffee filters, and tea bags.

To reduce your food waste BUY only what you need, check Best Before dates – food is still edible for a few days after it expires, SHARE your extra food with others in need.

WRAPPING PAPER:

- 1. REUSE gift wrap save wrapping paper and tissue paper for other gift giving occasions.
- 2. RECYCLE gift wrap glossy or matte gift wrap and tissue. Remove all ribbons, strings and tape from paper and crumple into a ball and put into recycling box.
- 3. FOIL WRAP is not recyclable. Put in garbage bin.

RIBBONS AND BOWS:

- 1. SAVE REUSABLE ribbons and bows for other gift giving occasions.
- 2. Put UNUSABLE RIBBONS AND BOWS in the garbage bin.
- 3. FOIL RIBBON AND BOWS are not recyclable. Put in garbage bin.

FOAM/STYROFOAM: Put all types of foam: packing foam, cups, plates, containers, meat trays, foam blocks and peanuts into the GARBAGE BIN. Place these items into a garbage bag to keep from blowing away during collection. Alternatively, packing Styrofoam can also be taken to London Drugs locations for recycling.

WREATHS, BOUGHS, AND GARLANDS: After the excitement and fun of the holidays are over how do you dispose of unwanted decorating items?

- 1. REAL CHRISTMAS WREATHS, GARLANDS AND BOUGHS can be put into the compost bins for composting. Breakup into smaller pieces to fit the bins.
- 2. ARTIFICIAL CHRISTMAS WREATHS: REUSE artificial wreaths, boughs, and garland, or GIVE to friends and family or to a participating charity. Put broken wreaths, boughs, etc. into the garbage bin.

BOXES: REUSE OR REPURPOSE gift boxes. BREAK down and flatten unwanted boxes, large or small, and place into your recycling box for recycling. PLEASE DO NOT put boxes into the GARBAGE BINS – this adds to our cost of garbage collection. Break them down and place in weekly recycling bin.

Who has bags of plastic bags looking for a home??

Thank you so much to everyone that has dropped off bags of plastic bags to the office and to my unit. In just one month we have collected almost enough bags to make a bed mat. That's one thousand plastic bags. That is not only exciting news for a homeless person anxiously awaiting their new bed mat to be made but WOW that's almost 1000 plastic bags that won't go to the landfill.

Do you want to keep plastic bags out of our landfills? Well we have found a way to do just that.

The Women's Circle has recently joined up with a group called Calgary Helping Homeless (YYCHH). They gather plastic bags of all sizes and colors and then crochet them into sleeping mats for the homeless. The bags are sliced and twisted into "plarn" (plastic yarn,) then woven together to make a surprisingly comfortable sleeping mat.

Not only does the project make good recycling of the plastic bags, and for a good cause, but the finished cushiony mats are impervious to weather and bugs; they are extremely popular among those who have received them. It's a small gift to keep the homeless a little more comfortable.

We had the opportunity to speak with a fellow that had just received one of these mats. He hung on to it for dear life. He let one of the Women's Circle members son hold it for a quick picture to show others what these mats look like.

If you have plastic bags that you would like to donate, please drop them off at B50 for the Women's Circle and we will get them in the right hands. This is an ongoing project so please keep the bags coming. I collect them from the office every Wednesday.



Butterscotch Confetti (From Leona Malcolm):

- 1 cup butterscotch chips
- ½ cup smooth peanut butter
- ¼ cup hard margarine or butter
- 1 package of miniature multi-colored marshmallows

Heat first 3 ingredients in large heavy saucepan on lowest heat, stirring often, until chips are almost melted. Do not overheat.

Directions


Spray paint the outer edges of the pinecone with green spray paint. Make it look like a real tree by leaving the inside brown. Let the paint dry.
