The Big Bin is here till January 15th. Please make use of it and leave any large materials outside of the shop fence.





Office Hours: Office hours are Monday to Friday, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. The office staff can always be reached by phone or email whether in the office or working at home. **The shop and office will be closed on Monday, February 19**th, **2024 for Family Day.**

Big Bin: The Big Bin is here until January 15th for disposal of larger items that don't fit in the regular bins.

With the increase of equipment and materials in the maintenance yard the Bin has been placed outside the yard. We ask that you please leave your items next to the big bin rather than placing them directly in the bin. This enables our maintenance team to pack the bin with maximum efficiency.

<u>New Housing Charges:</u> Just a reminder that the 2023/2024 financial year, including the member approved housing charge increases, began on November 1st, 2023.

<u>The new housing charges, already in effect, are</u> <u>as follows:</u>

- Two Bedroom \$1014
- Small Three Bedroom \$1046
- Large Three Bedroom \$1071
- Four Bedroom \$1097

Keeping Your Unit Info Up to Date: While we continue to work on a more streamlined process for the Annual Information Forms it is imperative that all changes to your information be provided to the office immediately to keep our records up to date. This includes contact information, communication preferences, vehicle license plate numbers, pets, residents, and emergency contact info.

It is a requirement of Members that ALL vehicle license plate numbers, pets, and residents (both members and non-members) be registered with the office. If it is discovered that there are additional vehicles, pets, or residents associated with your unit that have not been properly registered, we will be issuing fines. **Christmas Tree Disposal:** Any real Christmas trees that need to be disposed of can be left on the garbage bin islands in any of the parking lots to be picked up by our Arborist, Tom, for organic recycling. **He will continue to collect them regularly until January 15th, 2024.**

Visitor Parking Issues: The office continues to receive many complaints regarding members and residents parking in visitor parking stalls.

An important part of living in a cooperative is abiding by the rules that have been set out by the members. These "rules" of course are defined by our member approved Bylaws, Policies, and Procedures, including the Parking Policy.

In the spirit of cooperation, we ask that all SMHC Members and Non-Member Residents be mindful of the following rules, so to speak:

- It is a Member Obligation "to comply with all SMHC Procedures, Policies and Bylaws and ensure all non-member residents in a member's own unit also comply". (As per SMHC Bylaw 3.8[c].)
- That "members and non-member residents will park vehicles, including motorcycles, in their unit stall or rental stall only". (As per the SMHC Parking Policy.)
- And that *"Monitoring of parking is the members' responsibility"*. (As per the SMHC Parking Procedures.)

So, to everyone who calls Sarcee Meadows their home, please DO NOT park in any visitor parking stall anywhere on the property. (Unless specifically requested by administration to do so temporarily to accommodate construction access.)

Also, to anyone who notices abuse of the visitor parking by members/residents in your area, please report these via the Parking Complaint Form available at the office or on our *website here*. BLOOD DONATIONS

The month of January is usually a period of critical blood shortage. People stop donating blood during the holidays and when they get sick during cold and flu season. Blood donations are needed throughout the year, and it is important that a steady supply is always on hand. Calgary needs 550 new donors every month to help grow the donor base.

In Canada, the week of June 14th is known as "National Blood Donor Week". June 14th is designated as "World Blood Donor Day".

If you considering donating blood, the basic criteria are:

- Must be in good health.
- Must be able to perform normal day-to-day activities.
- Must be at least 17 years old; and
- Must meet height and weight requirements.

If you are between the ages of 17 to 23 your height must be 147cm (4'10") and your weight must be at least 50kg (110 lbs). If you do not meet these requirements you will not be considered for eligibility until you are 23 years old.

Formal eligibility for everyone will be determined by the staff at the donation center.

Blood donation usually takes 45-60 minutes. One unit of blood can be separated into four individual components that could help save multiple lives. The four components are:

- Red cells can be extracted and used to treat patients who lost blood due to trauma or those who are recovering from surgery.
- Plasma, the liquid part of blood, is typically administered to patients requiring treatment to improve blood clotting.
- Platelets clot the blood when cuts or open wounds occur and are often used in the treatment of patients with cancer or those undergoing organ transplants. When a blood vessel is damaged, platelets cluster together and stick to the opening of the broken vessel to plug the hole; and
- Cryoprecipitated antihemophilic, a portion of the plasma, is also used for clotting factors.

In a later issue, I will prepare an article on Blood Stem Cells.

If you are in good health and meet the eligibility criteria blood may be donated as frequently as every 56 days for males and every 84 days for females.

Blood donations are needed all year round. For more information on becoming a blood donor, or for locations sites in Calgary:

- 3. Add oil, shallots, and garlic to pan and sauté until golden.
- 4. Add cauliflower and sauté for a further 4 minutes. (Optional: add salt and pepper, to taste)
- 5. Serve with stir fries, as a substitute for rice, or garnish with finely chopped green onions and serve as a side dish.
